

# Advanced Placement Recognition

## Admission

AP students are considered for admission on the basis of Grade 12 subject marks. AP courses are acceptable as equivalents for required high school subjects and AP course grades may be combined with an approved high school curriculum to meet the university's admission requirements. Specific subjects and admission averages required for admission vary depending on the area of study students plan to pursue.

## Transfer Credit

The University of Saskatchewan recognizes the academic excellence of students enrolled in the College Board Advanced Placement (AP) program. Students with the knowledge and skills gained by completing AP courses are better equipped to meet the demands of university-level course work.

To acknowledge this, uSask grants advanced credit for most AP courses with grades of 4 or higher.

Students who are awarded transfer credit may decline the credit, if they choose. To do so, they will need to meet with an academic advisor and complete a Decline Transfer Credit Form.

## Transcripts

Students who write the College Board examinations must request a final, official transcript to be sent directly to the University of Saskatchewan by the College Board office.

The designated institutional (DI) code for the University of Saskatchewan is **0980**.

Students who do not write the examinations should request a letter to be sent to uSask from their principal or guidance counsellor confirming this choice.
