

Admission Requirements

1. GRADUATION FROM HIGH SCHOOL

If you are still completing high school, you can be considered for admission if you show that you will meet the requirements for your chosen program.

2. ADMISSION AVERAGE

For high school students or graduates an admission average is calculated using marks for five acceptable Grade 12 (senior-level) subjects:

ONE	Mathematics
ONE	English
THREE	Other acceptable Grade 12 (senior-level) subjects from the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Maximum of TWO natural sciences ▪ Maximum of TWO social sciences or humanities ▪ Maximum of ONE fine or performing art

4. ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY
