

# College of Education

Students are admitted to the College of Education through a competitive ranking based on admission average, or by meeting a minimum average for early admission. Students who are offered early or conditional admission must maintain a final admission average that does not fall below the lowest average accepted by the college to be fully admitted.

Admitted students must accept their offer of admission within the timeline specified in their offer letter. Wait-listed students will be contacted if/when seats become available. Apply online at [admissions.usask.ca](https://admissions.usask.ca).

## Direct entry to the Bachelor of Education degree program

### REQUIREMENTS AND DEADLINES

#### EARLY ADMISSION

Eligible applicants who apply, pay the application fee and submit transcripts and other admission documents by December 1 and have an admission average of 80%+ will be offered early admission.

Early admission offers will be mailed before the end of December.

**Application and document deadline:** December 1

**Minimum admission average:** 80%

#### Grade 12 students:

For applicants who are currently in high school, an early admission average will be calculated following the five-subject admission average formula using Grade 11- or Grade 12-level courses completed in the applicant's Grade 11 year. (Grade 11 subjects will not be used if the Grade 12 subject has already been completed.)

#### Grade 12 graduates:

Grade 12 graduates with less than 18 transferable credit units of post-secondary studies can be considered for early admission based on their final Grade 12 admission average, which is calculated following the five-subject admission average formula using only Grade 12-level courses. If the student is upgrading, proof of registration must be submitted by December 1.

#### Required courses:

- Foundations of Mathematics 30 or Pre-Calculus 30
- Biology 30 or Chemistry 30 or Physics 30 or Earth Science 30, or Computer Science 30
- History 30 or Social Studies 30 or Native Studies 30 or Sciences sociales immersion 30
- 30 level language other than English or a Fine or Performing Art

Two deficiencies among above subjects are permitted but must be cleared prior to entering second year of study.

#### REGULAR ADMISSION

Applicants who do not qualify for early admission will be considered for regular admission based on a competitive ranking and spaces will be offered to the top applicants.

Students will be notified of their admission status as soon as a decision is made, and by no later than mid-April.

**Application deadline:** February 15

**Document deadline:** March 1

#### Grade 12 students:

An admission average will be calculated following our five-subject admission average formula using Grade 12-level subjects completed up to the end of Term 1. Midterm grades for non-semestered (year-long) courses can also be used.

#### Grade 12 graduates:

An admission average will be calculated following our five-subject admission average formula using Grade 12-level subjects. If upgrading, proof of registration must be submitted by March 1 and course must be completed by June 30.

#### Required courses:

- Foundations of Mathematics 30 or Pre-Calculus 30
- Biology 30 or Chemistry 30 or Physics 30 or Earth Science 30, or Computer Science 30
- History 30 or Social Studies 30 or Native Studies 30 or Sciences sociales immersion 30
- 30 level language other than English or a Fine or Performing Art

Two deficiencies among above subjects are permitted but must be cleared prior to entering second year of study.

## Transfer to the Bachelor of Education degree program

### REQUIREMENTS AND DEADLINES

**Application deadline:** February 15

**Document deadline:** March 1

#### REGULAR ADMISSION

Applicants will be considered for admission based on a competitive ranking and spaces will be offered to the top applicants.

Students will be notified of their admission status as soon as a decision is made no later than mid-April.

Students will have earned marks for 18 or more transferable credit units by the end of April, and at least 9 transferable credit units by the end of December, will be considered for admission on the basis of university courses completed by the end of December.

For students who have earned for 18 or more transferable credit units before the end of December, the admission average will be based on the best of either:

- the cumulative average of marks for all transferable courses earned before the end of December, **OR**
- the average of marks earned for transferable courses in the most recent year of study (must include a minimum of 18 transferable credit units).

For students with marks earned for at least 9 transferable credit units but fewer than 18 by the end of December, the admission average will be calculated using marks earned for all transferable courses completed by the end of December.

Selection criteria for admission purposes for upper year transfer students may give preference to undersubscribed teaching areas, as determined by the Admissions Subcommittee. All applicants must meet minimum admission qualifications.

#### NOTES ON TRANSFER AVERAGE CALCULATIONS:

- If a course is repeated, the best attempt is used in an admission average calculation.
- If a student completes less than 18 credits in the most recent academic year (September–April), marks from previous sessions\* will be incorporated into an admission average calculation (without breaking up a session) until marks for a minimum of 18 transferable credit units are incorporated.

\*A session is defined as Regular Session (September–April) and Spring and Summer Session (May–August).

#### TRANSFER CREDIT AND RESIDENCY REGULATIONS:

Generally, courses taken at other institutions are accepted by the College of Education if they are appropriate to a B.Ed. degree program option, and if they are approved for transfer credit. Students will be notified of their transferable courses once official transcripts have been received and evaluated. Courses credited towards the B.Ed. degree are included in the calculation of overall, external, and Education averages for graduation purposes.

Students wishing to earn a B.Ed. from the University of Saskatchewan must complete at least 48 credit units from this university, 36 of which must be from the College of Education. At least 30 of the last 60 credit units credited towards the B.Ed. degree must be taken at the University of Saskatchewan, and 24 of these 30 credit units must be Education courses. In accordance with the regulations of the University of Saskatchewan, credit will be given for only 9 credit units taken at any one spring or summer session at another university.
