Direct entry to the Bachelor of Commerce degree program

ROLLING ADMISSION

Applications are considered throughout the admissions cycle and applicants are offered admission on an ongoing basis. Applicants who do not meet the admission average but otherwise qualify for admission may be placed on a waitlist.

Applicants who receive an offer of admission must accept the offer within the timeline specified in their offer letter.

At the discretion of the college, applicants who had been placed on a waitlist may be offered admission based on their place in the waitlist (determined by admission average).

Students who are offered conditional admission must maintain a final admission average that does not fall below the lowest average accepted by the college and fulfil any other conditions, as outlined in the offer of admission letter, to be fully admitted.

ADMISSION AVERAGE CALCULATION

Current Grade 12 students:

For applicants who are currently in high school, an admission average will be calculated following the five-subject admission average formula. The calculation may use Grade 11- or Grade 12-level* courses that appear on the up-to-date transcript or report card submitted to the Admissions Office in support of an application.

*Grade 11 marks can be used in admission average calculations as predictors of performance in corresponding Grade 12-level courses. Grade 11-level marks will not be used if the Grade 12 course has already been completed, or if the applicant has not shown they are enrolled in the corresponding Grade 12-level course.

High school graduates:

An admission average will be calculated following the five-subject admission average formula using only Grade 12-level subjects. If upgrading any courses, proof of registration must be submitted by the document deadline and courses must be completed by the date specified in your offer of admission letter.

ROLLING ADMISSION

ADMISSION QUALIFICATIONS

Pre-Calculus 30 (recommended) or Foundations of Mathematics 30 MATH 102, MATH 110, MATH 121, MATH 123, MATH 125 or equivalent at the university-level may also be used to meet the prerequisite requirement.	68%

ADMISSION AVERAGE CALCULATION

Applicants who will have earned marks for 18 or more transferable credit units by the start of classes and at least nine transferable credit units at the time of application will be considered for conditional admission on the basis of transferable university courses completed to date.

Applicants who have completed 18 or more transferable credit units at the time of application will be considered for admission on the basis of either:

- the cumulative average of marks for all transferable courses completed by the time of application, or
- the average of marks earned for transferable courses completed in the most recent year of study (provided the most recent year of study includes a minimum of 18 transferable credit units).

Applicants who do not meet the transfer average on the basis of courses completed by the time of application may be reconsidered on the basis of their final grades, provided a final, official transcript is received by the appropriate deadline and there are seats available.

NOTES ON TRANSFER AVERAGE CALCULATIONS:

- If a course is repeated, the most recent attempt is used in an admission average calculation. Edwards will use the first passing grade (50% or higher) in the program. The first attempt does not count toward the minimum 18 credit units attempted.
- If a student completes less than 18 credits in the most recent academic year (September-April), marks from previous sessions* will be incorporated into an admission average calculation (without breaking up a session) until marks for a minimum of 18 transferable credit units are incorporated.

*A session is defined as Regular Session (September-April) and Spring and Summer Session (May-August).

TRANSFER CREDIT AND RESIDENCY REGULATIONS:

While a student may receive transfer credit for all transferable courses they have completed, a minimum amount of coursework must be completed at the Edwards School of Business to earn a Bachelor of Commerce degree.

- No more than 50% (60 of 120 credit units) of the program for the Bachelor of Commerce degree may be transferred from another college or institution to the Edwards School of Business.
- No more than 50% of major classes may be transferred from another college or institution.
- Subject to program requirements, non-Commerce and free senior electives will be transferred in a way that maximizes your average.
