Kanawayihetaytan Askiy is a uniquely designed program, developed in collaboration with First Nations, to address land management needs. The certificate and diplomas, provide a broad range of topic areas in lands, governance and resource management. The program examines basic environmental, legal and economic aspects of land and resource management in Indigenous communities.

This program is designed for Indigenous land managers, economic development staff, Indigenous leadership, youth, federal and provincial government staff, and individuals interested in working with Indigenous communities.

To accommodate professional work lives, the Kanawayihetaytan Askiy program offers a blended learning method consisting of labs, online study and in-class experience. The program also provides students with the opportunity to increase their skill levels in communications, computers, time management, leadership, and research and project management.

CERTIFICATE

The **Kanawayihetaytan Askiy Certificate** examines basic environmental, legal and economic aspects of land and resource management in Indigenous communities. Students travel to Saskatoon three times a year for two weeks and work from their home-base for the duration of their studies.

DIPLOMA

Upon completion of the certificate, students have the option of continuing their studies with two diploma options at the College of Agriculture and Bioresources.

Diploma in Indigenous Lands Governance: provides students with a broad background in governance, management, administration and political science as they relate to Indigenous communities.

Diploma in Indigenous Resource Management: provides students with a broad background in resource management for Indigenous communities.
