



NURSING

All four years of the USask Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree are offered in Prince Albert. You can complete your pre-professional first year of courses at the USask Prince Albert Campus through the College of Arts and Science Nursing Prep pathway. While enrolled in your first year, you can also apply to the College of Nursing for years 2-4 of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program in Prince Albert.

In addition, Master of Nursing (MN), Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioner (NP), Post-Graduate Nurse Practitioner Certificate, and Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing programs offered by the USask College of Nursing can be completed from anywhere in Canada, including at the USask Prince Albert Campus where there is space for graduate students to study.

WHY STUDY NURSING IN PRINCE ALBERT?

The College of Nursing uses a distributed learning approach, where several technologies such as video, web conferencing, mobile and hybrid learning environments are utilized. Our technology-enhanced classrooms and our interactive skills lab, coupled with our many clinical placements, gives students a multifaceted learning experience.

The College of Nursing has professional academic advising services located at the Prince Albert Campus, including the University of Saskatchewan Community of Indigenous Nursing (UCIN) Knowledge Keeper and Indigenous Student Advisor. UCIN builds community and provides support for Indigenous nursing students.



The Prince Albert campus is a smaller, tight-knit community which gives students extra opportunities to learn one-on-one with each professor and learn at their own pace.

YOUR PATH TO NURSING

STEP 1

Apply to the College of Arts and Science

- On your application for admission, choose the College of Arts and Science Nursing Prep program and indicate your preferred location as the USask Prince Albert Campus
- Study hard and maintain a high average to give yourself an advantage on the competitive nursing application

STEP 2

Apply to the College of Nursing

- Apply to the College of Nursing and indicate the Prince Albert Campus as your first choice of locations
- Take Casper situational judgement test
- Send all transcripts and other documents required for your application

Admission to the College of Nursing is competitive and based on:

- Pre-professional course average (60% of your admission score)
- Casper test (40% of your admission score)

WHY STUDY DENTAL THERAPY IN PRINCE ALBERT?

USask's Bachelor of Science in Dental Therapy [BSc(DT)] degree program is the only degree of its kind in Canada. After successfully completing two years of continuous study, you will receive a BSc(DT) degree from the University of Saskatchewan and be ready to enter the workforce immediately as a dental therapist.

Our program in Prince Albert, as well as at our other locations, uses cutting-edge technology and includes opportunities for clinical work on patients, culminating in a one-month practicum placement in a community dental clinic during your final term.

GET READY TO APPLY



You can apply directly from high school to degree programs in:

- Agriculture and Bioresources
 - Arts and Science
 - Education
 - Kinesiology and
 - Edwards School of Business
- to begin your studies at the USask Prince Albert Campus.

To be considered for admission, you will need to:

- Apply for admission before the deadline for your program
- Complete specific required Grade 12 classes
- Meet the required admission average
- Provide proof of English proficiency (if required)

HOW WE CALCULATE YOUR ADMISSION AVERAGE

High school students

After you apply for admission and provide all the necessary documents, we calculate your admission average using the subjects and grades that appear on your high school transcript using this five-mark formula:

- One English
- One math
- Three other approved subjects:
 - Maximum of two natural sciences
 - Maximum of two social sciences or humanities
 - Maximum of one fine or performing art

Transfer students

If you have already attended college or university and have 18 credit units or more of transferable courses, your average will be calculated using the grades from your transferable university courses.

USASK TRANSITION ENTRANCE PROGRAM AND SPECIAL ADMISSION

USask offers pathways to admission for students who do not meet regular admission requirements, including:


