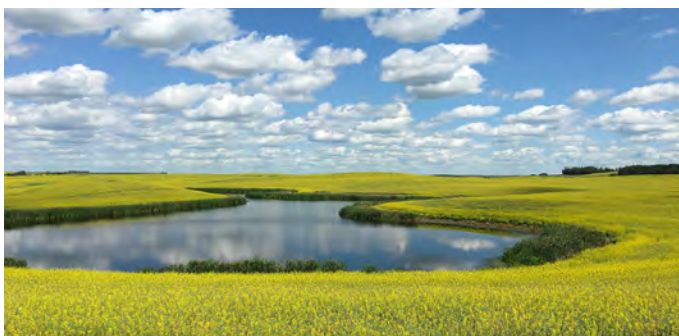

## Joint admission and USask Language Centre

If you are academically qualified for admission but need to improve your English before starting your degree program, you can apply for **joint admission** to the USask Language Centre to study English and undergraduate programs in any of our six direct-entry colleges. **There are three intakes each year:**

## Tuition, fees and expenses estimates

The following estimates reflect a typical amount you could expect to pay for your first year of a direct-entry undergraduate degree program if you enroll in a full course load (the maximum number of courses allowed—e.g. 30 credit units for Arts and Science students) in the fall and winter terms (Sept.-April).

CATEGORY	COST
International student tuition*	\$36,527 – \$54,953 CAD
Full-time, on-campus student fees**	\$1,120.48 CAD
USask residence rental rates***	\$4,732 – \$11,684 CAD
Textbooks and supplies	\$1,500 – \$2,500 CAD
<b>Total estimate per year</b>	<b>\$42,379 – \$67,757 CAD</b>

\* 2024-2025 tuition rates for a typical student course offering within each program are represented. International undergraduate tuition rates are 4.84 times the tuition rate for domestic undergraduate students. Tuition rates are subject to increase on an annual basis. New rates for the upcoming academic year are typically released in April.

\*\* Full-time, on-campus student fees for the 2024–2025 fall and winter terms (September–April) are represented. These fees fund benefits and services not considered part of normal instructional costs, such as athletics and recreation, wellness services, an unlimited student transit pass, and additional health and dental benefits through your student union. Some individual programs assess additional fees not included in this estimate.

\*\*\*Residence rental rates are assessed per-person depending on accommodation type, and include all utilities (electricity, water and heating), managed Wi-Fi and laundry. Rates are subject to rental rate increases on an annual basis.
